

## The Stroop Effect Test

The Stroop effect was discovered in the 1930s by John Ridley Stroop. During the test, you're given a list of color names, with each word being a different color than what they describe.

The test involves saying the color of a word, rather than reading the word itself. Your mind must process the two conflicting pieces of information, which slows down reaction speed and requires careful thought to get through.
